McAlle is winning all St. Hughs points while Vagabonds 'C' I'm afraid to say are not winning any points at all. Mal McEvoy certainly did his stuff for Wavertree Labour against Dutchs, beating Mai Green 20-221 21-17; 21-18; and George Files 19-21; 21-10; 21-18; and with Mark Smith beat George Files and Ken Dutch. Four good points for Labour there, the other winner being Mark over George Hughes. Wavertree would do even better if they could put their four strongest players each week. Thats all for now, you'll probably be reading these notes after the season has finished but please dont complain to me about that.

DIVISION 2 "Harry"

Although there are no radical changes in the division, certain changes have taken place which have made a significant difference to some teams. English Electric "B" have been devastated by losing their two best players, Brian Crolley and George Cheng to their first division teams. Up until Christ mas they have been maintaining a middle of the table position, but since then their morale and results have nose dived with a result that they will now be hard pushed to avoid relegation. Linace are also in a similar struggling position, having lost their star player Harry has been having a very successful Harry Reeve, who has gone back to sea. season, beating Ken Jones and Gordon Brownlee of Maghull (still not enough to prevent Linacre losing 4-6) beating Dave Crispin and Gareth Jones to inspire --Linacre to a fine 6-4 win over Police (A. Bob and Tom also provided the inspiration with two singles wins over each in a drawn match with Other teams in similar positions close to the top with both making changes are Maghull and Bath Street "A". Maghull have lost Ken Jones, but have replaced him with either of the Walmsley brothers from the Southport league whilst Bath Street are now playing Chris Coogan (another Southport recruit) in place of Val Just before these changes took place a close match between the teams ended in a 6-4 win to Bath Street "A". Police continue in much the same vein managing to draw with most of the top teams. This included Beauclair in a match in which Don Chalkley won both singles. They slipped up going down 4-6 to Maghull however, in a match where Steve Farr showed his improved form by beating Don Chalkley and Len Dyson. Colonsay "A" have been managing to put out a more regular side lately and as a result have moved up the league. They illustrated their potential by beating Y.M.C.A. "B" in the Rumjahn Cup with Sue Alexander and Peter Coyle both beating Ted Mandaluff. Colonsay were perhaps somewhat unlucky to be held to a draw by Beauclair after two double singles wins by Sue Alexander and Peter Coyle. However, their doubles did not match this and Beauclairs doubles pairs fought back from the brink of defeat. Colonsay "B" and Old Swan still labour at the foot of the division. For Old Swan however. Pete McAdam has been having a fine season with perhaps his best accomplishment coming against Y.M.C.A. "B" beating Harry Johnston and Ken Roscoe and then teaming up with Pete Dobbs to beat Johnston and Perhaps the best individual performance for Colomsay "B" was provided by Mal Cray in beating Bill Clayton and Chris Coogan of Bath Street "A". other point was provided by John Roper beating Clive Chislett.

Confusion over Bats

The new racket law seems to have given rise to a number of queries but the principal change comes into effect on January 1, 1978. This concerns the thickness of any pimpled rubber which, in future, will have an upper limit on its thickness of 2mm. The limitation of 4mm as the total thickness for sandwich rubber remains but the pimpled portion must not exceed 2mm. The rumour also has it that the colour of the covering on both sides of a bat must be similar. This is not so, you can still have red rubber on one side and, say, green rubber on the other side. If requested by your opponent, you must show him or her both sides of the blades before using a bat for the first time in a match. The new law is contained in the Norwich Union law booklets available from the E.T.T.A. office for the price of the postage.
