DIVISION 1 LES FRENCH

With about a third of the season gone the title battle seems to be between Wav.Labour, Vernon Sangster, champions Rafters and Bootle. Wavertree, with the acquisition of Keith Williams, are a formidable line-up, especially as Dave Roberts is in great form. Dave has 12-0 (wins-defeats). Add the tenacious defence of Roy Smith (10-2) and the attacking talents of Welshman John Hook (10-2) and they must be a good bet for top spot.

Vernon Sangster, with the addition of Steve Green 15-3, have emerged as strong contenders and will push Labour hard all the way. Spearheaded by the in-form John Rankin (16-0) and fast improving Peter Flint (11-1), who is rebuilding his game after changing his bat rubber, they have some excellent results, and yours truly is playing his part with 14 wins and 4 defeats to date.

Champions Rafters have made a disappointing start (for them), fielding weakened sides on a number of occasions. They drew with bottom club Plessey. Trevor Owens had two great wins over Wayne Percival and Paul Ashcroft. Rafters have dropped three sets to Eng. Elec. 'A' and 'B', Maghull and Wav. Lab. 'B', underlining their team problems. Only Alan Timewell (14-0) and new signing Graham Parr (8-0) have set the standards of last year.

Bootle, have their problems and I can't see them ending up as runners-up again this season. They have the same team but no real reserve strength. Tony O'Connor (11-0) has missed two matches so far and without him the team is considerably weaker. They had a disastrous visit to Maghull, without Tony, and went down 7-3. Maghull, with new signing Sherlock Hardman solving the 'Case of the Hutchings Forehand' and also beating Lawrence Kenwright for good measure, produced a great team effort. Both Neil and Mark Royden won their singles. Lawrence Kenwright's early form (10-6) has been disappointing. Paul Hutchings 14-1 has been a tower of strength, with Ricky Brown weighing in with a 10-4 record.

My forecast is that the teams will end up in the order listed at the top of the notes.

The relegation issue is much clearer. Plessey, finding themselves in the first division after coming only third in Div.2, are out of their depth and will surely be relegated. They have picked up only 13 sets from 7 matches. They are likely to be joined by Maghull 'A', who have had a tough start to the season playing all of the championship contenders in the opening weeks. Alan Chase must be devastated with only 4-14. Mick Allen, 4-16, is finding the going tough, but Frank Murphy 10-14 and Ted Birch 5-9 are doing better. It's nice to see Harry Harrison still around. He travels from Llanwrst to help out.

On last season's form, Wav.Lab.¹B¹ would have been obvious relegation candidates along with newly promoted Eng.Elec.¹B¹. Both of these teams have made

better starts than I expected, leaving Maghull first team third from bottom. With their new signing Eric (who's he?) Hardman, they should pull clear.

Wav.Lab.'8' are doing much better, mainly due to the better form of Ray Jackson and Mick Tierney. Ray has had some outstanding matches. He beat both Peter Flint and Steve Green of V.S. and also beat John Hook for good measure. Ray has 6-6 to date. Mick has 5-9. New signing Paul Kinsey has been disappointing with 4-10.

Eng.Elec.'B' have picked up sets regularly, with Brian Crolley 8-8 doing best. Kevin Parker and Alan Jones are fighters and have had some useful wins. The Electric 1st team, who have promoted Tommy Williams at last, could have been a force to be reckoned with, had not Phil Thomson gone abroad. Tommy, with 12-2, has been well-supported by Fred Pheysey 11-7 and Rod McPherson 6-10. Alec Sill, with 3-15 has been disappointing, but can claim a victory over Roy Smith.

Y.M. look like ending up in fifth position again. Peter tee won his first 12 sets but has since lost four to V.S. & Bootle. Peter Taylor has opened the season well (11-3) but Harry Johnston 6-6 and Jeff Huntington 8-6 have lost too many to make a real challenge at the top.

Wav.Lab.'A' & Eng.Elec.'A' are both useful sides, with good players capable of wins against the best. Wavertree's side have Rob Bevan 5-5 and Billy Wardle 9-5, from last year. They are joined by Phil Luxon 6-4 and newcomer Barry Wentworth 5-7 from Wirral. Electric have Joe Green 7-5 and Jimmy Lynch 9-5 from Wigan, together with Graeme Black 5-11 and Richie Craqq 8-8.

Vernon Sangster 'A' team have lost Adam Bennion, who is studying for, '0' levels. He has been replaced by John Greene, who's had a disappointing season, so far (5-13). Paul Gittins 13-9, is doing better than last season and Chris ford's game is improving continually. Chris has 12-10 to date, including a 21-17, 9-21, 23-21 win over Ian Smith, Warrington City player. Bill Harris 8-12, completes the side, which should keep clear of relegation, especially if John returns to some good form.

The big talking point of the season, so far, has been the transfer of Eric Hardman from Rafters to Maghull. In his last game for Rafters, Eric lost two straight to Kevin Parker and also to Graeme Black, sets he would have won convincingly in normal circumstances. Clearly all is not well in the Champion's camp.

The Cup match between Y.M. & Electric had some high drama. The first match ended up all square (Lee 2, Pheysey 2). In the replay the score stood at 5-4 to Y.M., with Fred Pheysey to play Harry Johnston. The game's situation was that if Fred won in two straight, Elec. would go through. If Fred won in three there would be a point count. Fred duly won the first and was 20-17 up in the second. with Y.M. all but out. Harry pulled it back to deuce and won the second.

Harry then won the third 21-16 to win the match. Peter Lee won 2 again. Tommy Williams won 2 for Electric.

Another tight match saw Wav.Lab.'A' beat Plessey 6-4. Four of the sets ended up 21-18 in the third and Phil Luxon's two sets were both won 26-24 in the third. Only Billy Wardle scored convincing wins. Bob Edwards and Ray Lavin both beat Paul Kinsey.

It's nice to see Trevor Owens back in the first division where he belongs, after a long absence. There are no better stylists around and all he needs is full fitness to be the powerful force of old. Trevor has 7-9 to date but will only get better.

Now for some individual performances - Ted Birch, still one of the finest sportsmen around, did well to beat Paul Ashcroft 12 in the third. Neil Royden beat Roy Smith 19, 24-22. Mick Allen beat Fred Pheysey 22-20 in the third, and lost 22-20 in the third to Tommy Williams in the same match. Well done, Mick. Frank Murphy beat Rod McPherson 14,19. Neil Royden beat Rob Bevan 20,14. Richie Cragg beat Lawrence Kenwright 17,15 and Ricky Brown 9,22. Richie also did well in defeat, going down 16 in the third to Alan Timewell and 19,19,19 to Paul Ashcroft.

To close I'm going to list a few players who are the life-blood of our game. People who give nearly everybody a good game but don't have that little extra that puts them in the headlines every week. They are also win with modesty and accept defeat in a sportsmanlike manner. If I mention Ricky Brown, Mick Tierney, Ray Jackson, Bill Harris, Peter Taylor, Fred Pheysey, Dave Tagg, Alan Chase, Frank Murphy, Ied Birch, Mick Allen, Bob Edwards, Ray Lavin, Peter Wass, I'm sure others will forgive me for missing them out.

SECOND DIVISION

The Second Division with two going up and four down is used to changes. However, this year sees many losses and from the 1st Division we have received Y.M.C.A. 'A' and Liverpool Jewish. Division 3A gave us Cadwa and Vernon Sangster 'B' while from 3B we have Brownmoor Park, Colonsay, Linacre and Wavertree Labour 'C'.

The start of the season has seen the almost new team of Electric Supply apparently already heading for Division 1, with the team of Malcolm McEvoy, Les Molyneaux, Brian Davey and Paul Baker, Lex. The only hiccups they have had were :- 5-5 draw at Cadwa with Neil Graveney beating Davey and Baker and 6-4 win away at Y.M.C.A. This last game appears close from the score card with McEvoy beating Stevenson 22-20; 22-20; and Molyneaux and Baker beating Hughes and Kendall 21-19 in the third. Electric have crushed their main rivals Bath St. 9-1, and Trinity 10-0. For E.Supply, M.McEvoy is unbeaten 14-14; L.Molyneaux 9-12; B.Davey 11-14; and P.Baker 8-14. Jewish have rearranged

their teams with completely opposite results, first team of E.Clein 10-12; Roy Bradbury 9-12; Jim McMillan 5-6; Bob Hudson 11-12 have played most of the games.

The first game against the Police was with John Henshaw in for McMillan and unfortunately for John he lost in straight games to Gareth Jones and Alan Wood. Gareth completed a hat trick by beating Eddie in two and the double with Alan. Eddie just beat Dave Crispin 22-20 in the 3rd. Colonsay then gave them a fright, this time Jewish having their full team. Dave Riley has had two good wins over Clein and Bradbury. A.Taylor also won 2, beating McMillan and Hodson in 3 (This is Bob's only loss in my cards) and what a way to lose 21-23; 23-21; 23-21 to Taylor. Jewish have had no more scores to date and with Clein and Hudson winning all since then there have been some big scores.

The other challengers for second place at the moment are Y.M.C.A. 'A' who have already used 10 players. The main players appear to be F.Loy 7-10, T.Kendall 5-10. D.Toi 5-6 and B.Hughes 5-8. There is no doubt that the Y.M. could rise to the occasion and their reserves are of better quality than most teams but they lost 6-4 to Bath St. They then reversed this result against Trinity. Another cracker was the narrow loss to E.Supply. Trinity have made a much better start than last year despite the same four or five determined players - Mike Keane 10-12; Tom Killop 7-14; John Higham 8-14 and Martin Truman 5-8 with brother not quite so successful. However, although thoroughly beating most teams. Trinity has not made an impact on their immediate rivals. The Cadwa team contain Mike Mahoney 5-6; Neil Gravener 3-6; Neil Jennings 1-6; Alan Radcliffe 2-6. The lads must be pleased with their early draw with the leaders. They drew 5-5 with Trinity (M.Mahoney 2-2; and Martin Truman 2-2) they then lost 2-8 to Jewish (Clein 2, Hudson 2). Cadwa's only wins M.Mahoney beat N.Gravener beat R.Bradbury. Bath St. started with Dave J.Henshaw and Butterworth 6-10, Ian McNee 7-10, Fred Bainbridge and Alan Walton, but Fred has departed to Brownmoor Park and Peter Ross has returned. I know these lads have made a good start to the season with only that big loss against the leaders to worry them. Welcome to Ian who tells me it is his first season in our league despite playing in the Business Houses League. A steady left hander, of sound disposition who uses his two varying sides to good advantage. A steady side who have beaten Y.M.C.A. 'A' 6-4; Trinity 6-4.

I have mentioned the main contestors for promotion, though V.Sangster '8' have already proved their worth with Sue Manning 6-8; Paula French 5-10; Ian Worsley 6-10. Against E.Supply at home Sue beat B.Davey in 2 and Paula beat P.Baker 21-19 in 3 in an 8-2 defeat. However, Jewish inflicted a similar score with Sue beating Roy Bradbury 23-21 in 3 and Montague/Wensley beating Clein and McMillan. Steve Gittins returned against Police whom they beat 8-2 and he looked vastly improved and an asset to Sangster.

Colonsay have D.Riley at (1) (6-8); A.Taylor 8-8; Barbara Kirkman 3-8; and

the first two named have made a cracking start to the season. Police have Dave Crispin, Gareth Jones, Tom Purcell and myself. The only one to come good consistently is the new streamlined Gareth with 10-14. Dave hasn't hit consistent form though Tom does have the close results go against him for instance losing 24-22, 35-33 to John Bolton. The rest of the Teams like Police are struggling with Bath St.'A' having only Billy Clayton 5-8 showing consistent form.

It appears that only Billy and Alan Waddington play regularly. I note a 10-0 walkover claimed against Colonsay but I hear the latter had made a genuine mistake and want a replay. Brownmoor Park have S.Wellman 5-6; A.Williams 4-8; W.Spencer and N.Cooke and re-inforced by Fred Bainbridge.

The best win was 9-1 away over Liverpool Jewish 'A', a good start for Wellman but at the moment going is not too easy.

Linacre have the same gang of pleasant but determined "lads" re-inforced by Mal Cray. The latter has had some good wins to date and there has been some good individual wins. H.Reeve beat M.Pu in 2 and Ken Ainsworth beat A.Kendall in 3; Mal Cray beat t.Molyneux in 3 and F.Lacey beat P.Baker in 2, team conconsistency at the moment is lacking. The other two teams Wav.Labour 'C' with J.Madigan, P.Davies, M.Neary, J.Ashley are really struggling as are Jewish 'A' with John Henshaw and Ian Borrows and others not having much success.

To those of you who thought you would have a good 'notes' writer this season I will apologise in advance. I am as surprised as anybody to find my name over the divisional notes. I was expecting a season in which I could concentrate on playing, when out of the blue, in a secondhand N.U.R. envelope, arrived a selection of score cards, with a demand for completed notes within the week.

I really haven't had much time to observe what has been going on, so I have no little stories to pass on. It really is a fraud to have me writing'notes when I have spent all of my previous undistinguished career extolling the virtues of the 'A' stream, and hiding in fourth and fifth divisions. Derek Sullivan, Bootle 'B' beat Les Evans, Elect. Supply 23-21; 21-16. J.Aaron, Jewish 'C' beat Bill Truman, Y.M.C.A. 21-13; 21-18. M.Poole, Jewish 'C' beat Mark Read, V.S. 'C' 21-14; 10-21; 22-20 and finally John Hodges, Jewish 'C' beat Rob Brockley, Cadwa

FROM THE SECRETARY'S DESK -

On a circular recently distributed to all Club Secretary's with the League Tables it was stated in error that under the new Bat Regulations all bats

would have to be covered on both sides. Players using one side only of the bat to strike the ball, need only have that side covered, but the side not used for striking the ball must be of a different colour to the covered side.

It is probable that the E.T.T.A. will at their next Annual General Meeting be asking for a substantial increase in fees, and the question is often asked "What do we get out of affiliation to the E.T.T.A.".

The following is an extract from an E.T.T.A document sent out to support their claim for increased fees which the Committee thought should be brought to the attention of all players. Appendix to NC.010

1252/505/NKR 12.9.83.

- Supposing the membership refuses an in increase?
 - The E.T.T.A's income from the other sources referred to in the note would reduce. Sooner or later, and probably sooner, the Association would have to dramatically curtail activities like coaching, team training, participation by England teams in international events, development of juniors and many other activities. The number of permanent staff employed would have to be reduced. Eventually, the Norwich Union English Open would have to be dropped as well as the English Junior Open. And there would be no chance of organising prestigious events such as the Commonwealth Championships, for example, which help to sell the sport to the public and give a boost to its sales potential.
- What will the Leagues get out of it?
 - The object is to ensure that the E.T.T.A. prospers. The leagues are the E.T.T.A. The leagues will benefit by increased membership which will bring them increased income. This will enable them to expand their activities. This is in addition to the increased benefit they will get from improved and extended services from the national body. But there is more to it than that. As table tennis players, supporters and enthusiasts, surely we want to see table tennis thrive and prosper. We want to see England players and teams winning international championships. Surely we would all like to have a World Champion, or even a champion of Europe. We all take pride in achievements by our national players and teams in the major sports of football, cricket and athletics, so why not table tennis? But success cannot be achieved without financial investment in it.
- Why do we want the E.T.T.A?
- With respect, the question is narrow, short-sighted and mean. It is the wrong question to ask. The right question is "Why does table tennis in this country require an E.T.T.A?" The answer is in order to provide a central co-ordinating point for a wide variety of aspects of organisation and administration of the sport. Some examples of these are representations of English table tennis in the I.T.T.F. and E.T.T.U., contacts and negotiations with the Sports Council, television, the sports trade and sponsors, organisations, coaching, umpiring and refereeing of international matches, team training, major tournaments, etc., etc., etc.

None of these aspects, nor many others could be co-ordinated and conducted satisfactorily - some would not be pursued at all - if there were no E.T.Y.A. Put another way, if there were no E.T.Y.A., one would have to be set up. Sport today is business and a sport needs a national body. There is no sport of any standing which does not have one.
