EDITORIAL

Another season well on the way - you can tell that as you are just receiving your Digest. The problems of the Committee, the Clubs and Secretaries alter very little (except for Maghull!?).

The same applies for the Editor of your magazine, I feel that over the years I have tried to cover and give my personal opinions on most of our most of our popular topics and difficulties, I feel that this gives me another problem that of repeating myself. So if you feel like airing your opinions with a bit of luck you can have the front page.

DIVISION ONE KEN ARMSON

The obvious opening remark for this season must be where have all the players gone, for many familiar names have disappeared, sunk without Quite a few club secretaries may well retort, where has club trace. loyalty gone with the increase in the number of players deserting clubs for no apparent reason. Three a side was claimed by its supporters to be the lifeline and incentive needed to revitalise first Division Table Tennis and yet at the conclusion of its first season several clubs have lost the services of regular players. Is it the lure of lifting titles and winning trophies or is it just plain old fashioned poaching? Poaching, has anyone ever tried to get to grips with this problem? Players are bound to their clubs until 30th June each year yet poaching, better known as stealing of players by stealth, goes on unabated every season. No-one, it seems, having the courage to take up the challenge it presents.

Vernon Sangster must feel sick at the sudden demise of Peter Flint as their player and his emergence as a Cadwa player for it was known last season that he would be joining them. Jack Lambert, English Electric, must be feeling even sicker at the apparent desertion of Phil Thompson, now a Bootle S. C. player. Bootle in return can point to John Rankin, back for a season, talk of his giving Table Tennis up, then sudden re-emergence as a Bath Street player. Perhaps I could give an example of what club loyalty really means. Ted Mandaluff, a player known and respected throughout the league. A past Number One for Liverpool Y.M. and now a Number Four for their 'B' team, but still with them. I could also mention Fred Pheysey, English Electric and many more.

On to the changes and disappearances of other players. Rob Evans from Wavertree Labour to Electric Supply otherwise known as Mal McEvoy Ltd. Ex Rafters Alan Timewell, now Wavetree Labour. Paul Gittins has left Vernon Sangster following his joining the Police and quite naturally opted to play for them. Keith Williams has gone into semi-retirement. Biggest upheaval has taken place at Maghull with Neil Royden, Steve Green, Gary Watson and Simon Jones leaving after an apparent internal club strife leaving Wayne Percival in a desperate search for a club in order to qualify for City team status.

With two First Division teams, Maghull now have a first Team playing at English Electric who do not want to be known as Maghull, but to be otherwise would lose them their coveted first Division status, and an 'A' team of players who would prefer to be playing anywhere except the first Division for Maghull. Full marks to the sacrificial victims, Bill Salter, Stuart Fay and Dave Lamsden for accepting the heavy defeats this involves. I wonder if they have asked themselves the question, what if their unwilling First Team stays up and the players leave next season, will they also have to replace them and in turn face yet another season of being battered. All this and having to pay £5.05 registration fee plus club fees shows a high degree of club loyalty.

On to the early events of the season. I have once again been honoured to hear the views of Mal McEvoy who assures me that it is definitely all over bar the shouting and that Keith Williams will not even be missed as they canter to an easy double. An unusual source of information has emerged in the shape of Dave Roberts (Wavertree Labour 'A') who earnestly assured me as they crashed to defeat at the hands of Vernon Sangster, that they were a good bet for the Cup. Lost in his dreams, Dave wondered aloud who their opponents in the Final would be. Even Malcolm, who was present, blanched at this display of confidence in the face of yet another defeat.

Peter Lee concedes that Malcolm could be partly right, but that Mal (Electric Supply) McEvoy, could just as easily find themselves that far adrift that shouting is the only way they may be heard.

Certainly the early results indicate that Electric Supply will want some stopping. To date Malcolm has only lost to Roy Smith when he was defeated 17 and 15; but I hear talk of an even heavier defeat at the hands of Phil Thompson. They have replaced Keith Williams (rumour has it that his season lay-off will be much shorter) with Rob Evans, backed up by Wayne Percival with Les Molyneux being allowed to be the third player whenever the whim takes Malcolm.

Liverpool Y.M.'s team consists of Peter Lee, Peter Taylor and Malcolm Pu, and the weak link at the moment appears to be Malcolm Pu, having lost six of his first twelve sets. He has never really fulfilled the promise of earlier seasons when he suddenly dropped out, but these are early days and regular play in the First may bring back his previous consistency. With Peter Taylor losing 4 from 12 and Peter Lee 2 as opposed to three sets overall by Electric Supply the outcome does appear inevitable.

Bootle have ranked Neil Royden as being a first Team player but he has yet to put in an appearance. Phil Thompson is as good as ever, has Lawrence Kenwright to back him up, but the third man appears to be based on a 'pot-luck' principle which rules them out of the championship. They have also been ignominiously ejected from the Readman Cup which they won in such great style last season.

With past contenders, Wavertree Labour, making changes in their line-up involving Dave (Cup Final) Roberts dropping into the 'A' team along with Phil Luxon and Mick Tierney and Roy Smith moving up into the First Team. The impression given here is that they do not intend to mount any real challenge and as their First Team lost 8-2 to Electric Supply their results confirm this. Their two sets came from a Roy Smith victory against Mal McEvoy and a win for Paul Kinsey against Les Molyneux. Paul's game ranges from spells of brilliance to just spells.

Their 'A' team have not fared much better and had a first three match

spell of playing short due to an internal misunderstanding. Dave and Phil managed a very creditable draw against Bath Street with Phil Luxon taking a set from John Rankin 17 in the third. Could this be the cup form which Dave speaks of.

Bath Street just scraped clear of relegation last season but things look much brighter now with the signing of John Rankin plus the fact that there are several teams much weaker than them who will push them well clear. Early results would seem to indicate that Bootle and Vernon Sangster have had the beat of John Rankin for his form has been poor and he has had a very inauspicious debut for them losing five of his first eight sets. Mr. Reliable, Ken Jackson has also dropped 4 from eight and Ian McElwee six from eight, so it is just as well there are several weaker teams. A little bird has whispered to me that Ken is still wearing his Wavertree Labour badge, can we have it back, please.

English Electric have brought in Richie Cragg to replace Phil Thompson and look likely to have a fair season with no problems, but they did come a cropper against a Cadwa team without Peter Flint and lost 9-1, their lone set coming from the doubles. Their 'A' team fared better against the same team picking up 4 sets. They too have nothing to fear even though their ranked No.1 Alec Sill, has yet to put in an appearance. Graeme Black has made a good start winning five of his first nine including one against Electric Supply beating Les Molyneux.

Liverpool Y.M. 'A' also newly promoted along with Electric 'A', although not being all that strong easily disposed of Vernon Sangster now under their new name of Walton Hall Avenue S.C. (what a mouthful). I spent many happy days in Walton Hall Park as a boy (about 10 years ago, give or take a few). Back to Table Tennis. They won 10-0 and this match saw the return of Eric (quicksilver) Hardman to the Y.M. Team.

Vernon Sangster who must be the chameleons of Table Tennis as they change their name more often than most players change their bats, dont appear to have much chance of avoiding relegation of their 'A' team no matter what name they play under. Having lost Peter Flint and Paul Gittins they have to rejuggle their teams with Steve Gittins, Rob Lowe and Neil Montague forming the First and Chris Ford, Paula French and Brenda Buoey the Second. Neil has yet to play for the First and Chris has yet to play for the 'A'. I have long since given up trying to analyse their rankings and with the present line-ups relegation seems unavoidable, but it could be avoided by sensible use of their playing strength. The First team will fare much better with the ever improving Steve Gittins playing at Number One and Robert Lowe providing a good back up.

Cadwa, strengthened by the signing of Peter Flint, are looking good after a very dodgy start against Bootle. Even with Peter out they lost 4-6 to a Bootle team who were one short and then had one set

taken from them because Mike Mahoney had not registered and was ineligible. Ironically he lost his two singles but won the double with Peter Flint only to lose the point, and the card also appears to have arrived late they will now lose £2 from their funds. Definitely not their night. The picture at present showing at the bottom of the league of a clear cut drop into the Second Division for Maghull 'A' and Vernon Sangster 'A' could easily change into a real battle or an even greater formality. That Maghull 'A' will be relegated, and with possibly the lowest sets total ever, goes almost without saying, but the chances of Walton S.C. 'A' could well improve even if they got a lot of ground to make up.

DIVISION TWO D. CHALKLEY

I am afraid these notes will be very brief because without warning a few match cards came through the post from Ken. He also gave me the usual command to come to heel and get cracking. I am afraid I was not too good because I have just retired after 31 years from the Police Service (so has John Christian). Vernon Sangster 'C' is no more and the 'B' team is now Walton Hall Park 'B' but having to give some games away because they have to be out of the centre by 10 p.m. Maghull 'B' is a complete change with players playing several divisions too high because of several leading players leaving. To date they have not won a single point but were still cheerful when we played them. Jewish look likely to be challenging

Labour 'B' but knowing how players can be so readily recruited when promotion is possible, I am not yet making any more forecasts. Obviously Maghull 'B' are apparently doomed for relegation with two others, who is to accompany them? I will mention some results and games next time but how about this one:— John Hedges with his wooden but beating Billy Clayton's 21/19 in 3. Ied Mandaluff started the fashion a few years ago and is now 'Hanging in' at Number Four in the very good Y.M.C.A. team. Billy is still playing well and it is quite a treat for us Third Division players to see how well the game can be played with wooden faced bats. J. Quinn beating Ron Jones 21/23; 21/18; 23/21: in an all action hitting game. Dave Cohen (Jewish) showing that life really does begin at "30" with a fine tactical win over new English Electric, Richard Hardaker (Number One) 18 and 10, Colin Eyles in the same match 21-17 in third. Mrs. J. Connor (nee Monaghan) in a topsy turvy game against Dave Graham 21/10; 11/21; 21/18.

Good to see Waterloo back where they belong having signed ex journalist star Mike Griffiths to lift them out of the Fourth Division first time round. Andy, Mike and the Nelsons along with John Simm have all had some extremely good wins so far. Newcomers to this Division are Rodney Youth and Warwick Bolam and although they are not promotion candidates they are not doing too badly. Southport First Divison player Richard Hardaker to English Electric to join the two Colins and Brian Aldred, Don Davies, Clive Roberts and George Higham from Rafters to Cadwa.

Congratulations to our England Number Six (in age group), Alec Gould a credit to his only club Bath Street and a well deserved honour, which should give us all something to aim for. Alec's exaggeratedly fair serve and his well disguised forehand hit are as good as ever.

Just picture the scene, Y.M.C.A. top of 3B are leading English Electric 4-3 in the Hyde Cup. Electric are without their Number One player and have brought in Margaret Collins at Number Four. Y.M. have yet to play their 100% Number One Wing Law, their excellent Number Two Steve Graham and Number Four Ted Mandaluff. LIVERPOOL CLOSED TOURNAMENT

The Committee has agreed to continue the policy which has the general approval of League Members, of holding a separate Finals Night. However, being mindful of the wish that the period between the Tournament and the staging of the Finals should be kept to a minimum, it has given considerable thought to the most suitable dates for this Season's event.

After taking into consideration availability of premises, Cup Finals, Replays, and Public Holiday dates, together with the need to hold the event either close to, or immediately following the end of the playing Season, it has now been arranged on Tuesday, 17th March, 1987. This decision does of course raise the problem of Teams with League matches scheduled for Tuesday 17th March.

The Committee has therefore ruled that as the Closed Tournament is held for the benefit of all League Members, any Team (either Home or Away) with a League match due to be played on Tuesday 17th March will be permitted to postpone the match due on that night, subject of course to giving reasonable notice, both to their opponents and to the Fixture Secretary (it would not be considered reasonable for a Club to wait until the end of the Tournament on Sunday 15th March and then postpone because they had a player concerned in the finals).

It is the Committee's hope that as the date for the Finals is so close to the end of the Season, Clubs wishing to avail themselves of the dispensation referred to, will, wherever possible, bring forward the playing date. The date for the re-arranged match will in any event remain the prerogative of the Home Team, but before it can be played it will be necessary to give their opponents and the Fixture Secretary in writing, seven clear days notice of the new date
