At the end of last season it was beginning to look as if we would have a more finely balanced division this season with the possibility of more closer finishes and a wider spread of teams battling for honours. Such hopes, cherished by many for several years, meekly went the way of past seasons as we experienced the all too familiar pattern of club losses and gains and

worst of all the complete loss of a club. Also back with us already is another team having to do a 'Maghull'.

Fernhill is the club which has gone and with it has gone Dave Wilson who founded the club and was mainly responsible for its success. We can ill afford to lose players of his ilk for he tried to put back into this League something to replace the enjoyment he received from having been a member. His players have dispersed, with the most talented making only guest appearances for their new clubs.

Cadwa, struggling to survive the internal problems which split the club, and cost them so many players, have brought Graham Parr and Paul Ashcroft in to replace Keith Williams and Mike Mahoney. This split has seen them move to Liverpool Y.M. to team up with Peter Lee to form a formidable combination. Peter Taylor having been relegated to their 'A' team and Malcolm Pu moving to Y.M.C.A. in the 2nd Division. Peter sees his team as a sound bet for the title and having disposed of champions Wavertree Labour in the cup entitles him to his views. Not wearing the same rose coloured glasses, as Peter, I see it differently. For me, they lack the strength in depth for such a bid, relying heavily on Keith to swing results in their favour. A 6-4 defeat by Electric Supply supports this view as Keith was their only singles winner.

Phil Thompson has also returned and transferred his allegiance back to Colonsay. His inclusion has given them the extra strength needed to make them serious contenders for the title. Chris Ford is not making forecasts but with such a strong line-up must fancy their chances. They have strength in depth, great ability, Stuart Richards at No.1 and a string of victories behind them. Their weakness lies in the fact that Chris and Phil are suspect under pressure and this could be their downfall. Electric Supply exploited this to the full and emerged winners of their clash with Mal McEvoy taking away Stuart's 100%. Not a great set-back, for titles tend to be won by teams notching up convincing victories against the weaker teams as Wavertree Labour proved last season. That is their second weakness, dropping too many sets due to not regularly turning out a full strength team. They need to get their act together quickly if they mean to be champions.

Bath Street are another team having suffered a setback having lost Paul Dilger for the rest of the season. As I forecast last season his results have improved and he has been in tremendous form and this was reflected in their results. His loss is a tremendous blow and one which leaves them as just an average 1st division team. His replacement would appear to be Mike Keane, who having left Bootle Y.M. and moved to English Electric has just as quickly left them and joined Bath Street. I wonder why. Amongst all the doom and gloom we have received a bonus with the return of Police, back after a long absence, and bringing with them the welcome return of John Rankin and Paul Gitten. John is not the player he once was, his long lay-off having blunted his style, but who knows what a return to 1st division play will bring about. I wonder how he sees the strength of the present 1st division compared with his previous spell.

Wavertree Labour are also having their share of problems having lost all their Welsh contingent with the exception of Justin Evans. They were unable to put out a third 1st division standard team and did everything correctly in their bid to have their 'B' team officially taken out. Their request was declined and they had to soldier on. They rightly declined to make do with the alternative put to them of conceding 3 walk overs as this would have been a costly exercise. It seems certain we will see more of this in the future and it is time someone grasped this particular nettle. The only thing left now is to see if Labour 'B' fare better than Maghull

see wise. Their 'A' team looked likely to do much better and are fortunate that their 'B' team is there to hold them up. Wavertree 1st team have gone for a four man team by including Justin Evans following his excellent performance last season. Unfortunately Justin is playing below par as isDave Roberts, this, coupled with some bad results has lost them ground. They were unlucky to meet a Bath Street team which included Paul Hutchings who was making his only appearance for them this half. They duly went down 6-4 with the two Pauls' winning three each. They could only manage a draw with Y.M. 'A'. Dave Roberts losing his three. Their problem is still the lack of player assured of victory and they have to work hard for their points. They won the title last season by keeping going as others stumbled and this season will have to do the same again.

English Electric are the reverse of Wavertree Labour having a player of high standard at No.1 but lacking the back-up strength to be a front runner. Andrew Eden is said to be in great form and he disposed of the Y.M. trio all in 2 straight. Why, I wonder, was a non-registered player, Wayne Percival, a member of the team chosen to play against the Chinese touring team, when presumably players such as Andrew and Malcolm were available. They could have been given expert tuition in that quaint old custom of smashing your bat by our resident expert.

Colonsay 'A' and YM' A' can afford to look down at Labour 'A' & 'B' knowing that however badly they fare relegation will not be a problem with these two teams to support them. But is that same relegation a threat to anyone? We started with a 14 team division, have two vacancies, two to come up will make the 14. Question now to be answered, perhaps not until the season ends is, will they decide to maintain this as a 14 team division thus saving Labour 'B' from the drop, or make a 12 team as with the others and to do this relegate the bottom two? Wavertree might be on their way to a record in more ways than one.

Almost forgot Electric Supply. At present out front and having beaten all the other contenders would indicate that a Malcolm forecast could at last be correct. After their victory over Colonsay and his destruction of Stuart Richards' 100%. Malcolm is full of what they are going to do this season. Certainly they are going well with Rob Bevan playing well and Les Molyneux playing even better, but can they keep it up. Their ace is having Lawrence Kenwright to call on as a reserve. Only a fool would ignore their claims and perhaps I fall into that category. Then again, perhaps I am not.

Their normal squad of Bob Edwards, Trevor Owens, Ray Lavin and newly signed ex-Vags, Bobby Owen are a pretty formidable line-up. They did lose their first match against Cadwa 'A', who turnedout Ken Hartley but since then they've never looked back. Both English Electric teams are close behind.

On the other hand, though I hope they prove me wrong, my tips for demotion are two from Bootle Y.M. Electric Supply 'A' and Liverpool Y.M.C.A. 'B'. To be fair, Bootle Y.M.C.A. have a few matches in hand and the Liverpool Y.M.C.A. squad of Jeff Huntington, George Smith, Francis Lay, Jimmy Clewett, Ted Mandaluff and Peter Lau should do better.

Looking through the cards I've got, the second division appears to be as tough as ever with lots of draws and six sets to four wins. Bath Street 'A's first match of the season against Fords must have been a good game to watch with six of the ten sets going to 21/19 or closer in the third. Billy Proffit for Fords won his two singles comfortably but Bath Street won five of the six close sets, including both doubles to clinch the match 6-4. Watch out for Bath Street they've obviously gotta lotta bottle'. Both English Electric sides have had good wins and they usually turn out settled sides. Tony Leary has filled in for both of them and has had several convincing wins including a straight sets victory 21/12; 21/10; against Justine Thomas of Cadwa. A good win because Justine Thomas certainly hasn't been hanging around this season winning doubles against Bootle J.C. Peter Scarisbrick, and Steve Neild, and again at Electric Supply against Alan Biggs and Alan Radcliffe. Close matches seem to be at a premium, Barbara Smallwood (Bath Street) beat Clive Roberts (Cadwa) 17/21; 25/23; 23/25; and teamed up with Ian McElwee to beat Clive and Billy Hargreaves 19/21; 23/21; 21/19; Dave Garbe (Fords) lost to Joseph Yau (MCYA) 17/21; 22/20; 23/25; Derek Sullivan (Bootle YMCA) lost to Bob Edwards (Plessey) 21/19; 23/25; 19/21; Billy Proffitt (Fords) lost to Mike Allen (English Electric) 22/20; 16/21; 23/25; and again to Andrew Clark (Bootle J.C.) 22/20; 18/21; 24/22: and Ian McElwee (Bath Street) lost to Frank McCann (English Electric 'B') 21/23; 21/15; 24/26. Three players deserve a mention in saving their teams from a whitewash. Tom Killip beat Bobby Owen 15/21: 21/18: 21/13; in Bootle's Y.M.C.A. defeat by Plessey. Dave Southall beat Chris Spedding 21/19; 24/22 when his side went down at Bootle YC. A great win because it is Chris's only league defeat to date, and Jeff Huntington beat Alan Chase 21/17; 21/16 to score YM's only set against English Electric 'A'.

Now if anyone would like a mention in these notes all you have to do is beat one of the top players this season. To help you I've devised my own special 'hit list'. In alphabetical order

Rourke, Mike Power, Ian Wensley, Bill Harris, John O'Sullivan, Barbara Kirkman and Paula French. A very formidable 3rd division side and one which I would normally tip to win the league.

But English Electric 'D' have signed the ex Bootle team who have won the 3rd division cup and league on many occasions, Frank Brady, Keith Miller, Ricky Brown, John McLoughlin and Tommy Downing.

The 3rd top team should be Plessey with a team consisting of Ted Gilmour, Mark Whittaker, Peter Wass, Paul Moran and Trevor Hughes. I think these teams will dominate this season completely and any team who wants fame, only has to do well against them, O.K. so much for theory, what has happened so far? Colonsay and Electric 'D' are both unbeaten so far and fought out an exciting draw when the two teams met, Ricky Brown and Bill Harris both winning three each, but Colonsay were without Colin Rourke. Jack Davidson playing well this season, beating Colin Owens for the one point, Colin Owen and Phil Wilkinson (both ex Warwick Bolam) have had some great wins so far and will make a difference to Bath Street.

Barbara Smallwood did well to hit off fellow No1 Staurt Fay 18, 18 but lost to the counter hitting of Rod Bulmer in Maghulls 6-4 win over Bath Street Maghull's ace resrve Kevin Lewis made the difference by winning his three games, Kevin's tennis loop really works with the smaller racquet and the added side spin makes it a match winning shot.

Obviously the survivors from last season will be hoping for better things following the departure of Bootle JC 'A' and Plessey 'A' and the added departure of Police 'A'. Those coming down, Rodney Youth and Electric Supply 'B' will be hoping for speedy return to the 3rd. How will it all pan out?

As usual the rude awakening familiar to the lower divisions awaits all would be contenders. First in the queue to provide this is Waterloo. They have stolen a march by signing Alan Walton, ex Bath Street and finalty promoting Alan Reid to No.2. Their decision last season to keep him at No.4 must have cost them vital points. Just by moving him up and the rest down one could have pushed them into 2nd place. With their house in order and Alan Walton at No.1 they will take some stopping. Alan 'W' is a steady experienced player and a great clubman. Prior to their meeting with Plessey 'B' I might have been tempted to forecast be could achieve the magic 100%. Alas, for any such hopes Alan, himself, may have had, for after seven matches without defeat he came up against the redoubtable one and only Trevor Hughes. For good measure, Trevor also beat Alan Reid. Trevor's forte, in addition to a style all his own, is to submerge his opponents with highly flowery comments on the quality of their shots. Players basking in this flood of praise suddenly find the game is over and they have lost. Quite a lad, is our Trevor. Why is he now with Plessey, I don't know. Do you? Various rumours abound as to the split in Cadwa's ranks, but the winners are Plessey and the losers those hopefuls in this division who find a promoted Plessey 'B' to be as strong as their 'A' team who

proved a stumbling block last season. At present they are 4th, due to too many 6-4's. I expect a much better return once they decide which formation is their strongest for the task in hand.

Rodney Youth found the 3rd too strong and were obliged to rejoin the 4th and are seeking a quick return. They lost the services of Alan Noor to Liverpool Y.M. last season, but he is back having found that life is pretty ruthless the 1st. His return is reflected in their results. Presently in 2nd place and achieving big wins they will take some stopping. Electric Supply 'B' who came down with them are currently in 3rd place but I can't see them maintaining that for long. A useful team obtaining steady results but lacking the strength needed to turn an outside possibility, into a positive challenge. Their main problem being that the club suffers from 1st division syndrome. Our other newcomer, Bath Street 'C' also have an experienced line-up and will do well, but their results are not consistent enough to make them contenders for the title. They can, and will, cause upsets, but are unlikely to achieve further promotion.

No real changes at Brownmoor Park and the team should succeed in maintaining a position in the top half, or just below, as they did last season. Les Travis, back from I don't know where, trying to prove every ball can be soundly walloped. This game needs characters like these, like I need £1m. There is more to any sport than just the winning. I once had the pleasure of watching Dave prove to a young cocky and arrogant player from my own club, who thought he was better than he was, that you can be a winner even when losing. Possibly the only occasion I have hoped one of my players would be beaten.

What can one say about Bootle YM 'A'. A great crowd, less a few familiar faces striving to stay up and finding, like Jewish 'B'., that this time it might just be beyond them. I hope I will be proved wrong, but doubt it. Maghull 'A' will be hoping even more fervently that I am right for if one of those two can pull it off the Maghull team will be favourites to take their place.

Pausing to reflect on how you can be kicked in the teeth when you reach for the stars, one has only to look at Maghull. A few years ago players flocked to join them and they had it all at their feet, only to see it all slip away and the club crumble as the dream faded.
