## **EDITORIAL**

Happy New Year, and our first edition, the reason being that we are now only having two magazines per season. A bit of a difference from our original five issues, finance of course is the problem. The question was brought up at the A.G.M. and to say that the meeting was supportive of the Digest was putting it mildly. Led by Dave Cohen and Trevor Owens and many others. The meeting discussed ways and means of keeping it going, including increased subs. However, any general meeting has the backbone of table tennis in attendance - mainly the secretaries and committee. How do the rank and file feel?

As our Chariman reports elsewhere we have sadly lost one of our table tennis friends and top administrators Don Cameron. Table termis was well represented in the crowded congregation at his funeral led by Life Member Jack McCaig, Chairman Arthur Upton, Vice Chairman Stan Clarke and Secretary John McKim. How fortunate we were to have had the opportunity to show Don in the only ways we can in table tennis of our appreciation for the work he has put in and the help he has given for so many years.

Perhaps I am out of order in saying this but I feel it should be said we have other members who have put in long and sterling service to Liverpool table tennis - think about it! Do we have to wait?

The division has been depleted by the non-registering of a number of players and the reluctance of others to play regularly. This has resulted in Champions, Eng. Elec. having lost their entire 1st team after only one season and expected challengers Colonsay unable to be certain of just who is willing to play each week. This change of fortune finds Wav. Lab. comfortably out in front with the only apparent challenge coming from their own 'A' team. Of the other possibles, Liv. Y.M. and Cadwa, Y.M. have temporarily lost the services of Peter Lee due to business committments and replaced him with the capable Dave Tagg. With Peter having been the real driving force behind the team any possible challenge has not materialised. Cadwa have the strength but like Colonsay seem to have difficulty putting out their strongest team every week.

Way. Lab. have comfortably beaten off the possible challengers and strengthened by the return of Rob Bevan have virtually made it a one horse race. Their only reversal, ironically, being a 6-3 cup defeat at the hands of their own 'A' team whom they had previously beaten 8-2. Unfortunately for them it was one of Rob Bevan's 'can't be bothered trying' nights and this, allied to the determination of the 'A' team to win, was their downfall.

Lab 'A' have a much matured Bernie Wentworth back and playing better than ever. He is receiving strong support from Gary Watson and Mick Tierney. They have now been joined by another wanderer back on Merseyside, Steve Green. Having beaten a weakened Colonsay team 6-4; drawn twice with Cadwa, drawn with Y.M. and also knocked them out of the cup and beaten Bootle J.C. they are full of confidence and feel certain their name is already on the cup. The Draw, however, has paired them with Cadwa who have the strength in depth to win. It is rumoured they have lost the services of newcomer Peter Lander due to his having been deported to Australia. This may be a setback for them and is certainly a loss to the division. In his first few matches he quickly showed his ability with a string of wins. However, they also have Alec Bryce back after a lengthly absence and his results indicate he is in great form. Their match against Colonsay saw the unusual sight of Stuart Richards losing his three to Peter Lander, Graham Parr and Neil Gravener. Two weeks later they cannily played the return fixtures and this found Stuart in better form beating Graham and Alec, but losing again to Neil. The result was another win for Cadwa, this time 7-3 but nine sets went to three.

For newly promoted Boolte J.C. it looks like being a good first season having given notice of their intentions last season when they inflicted a cup defeat on Wav. Lab. in the Readman Cup. They showed their form in early season with a 6-4 win against a fairly strong Cadwa team and followed this with a draw against Y.M. Andy Clark inflicting a rare 2 straight defeat on Keith Williams.

There are not many in the division who can claim this distinction and certainly not from a newly promoted team. If this team stays together then we may well see them making a strong challenge for honours in a future season.

We all have our problems but Colonsay probably feel theirs are the worst for after losing out in the championship race last season they now find that the chance to make good this season has been blighted by the non-availability of their best players some of whom appear to have been infected by the 'only available when it suits me' bug. This has resulted in strong teams, weak ones and on some occasions incomplete teams. The end result beng mixed fortunes and no chance of anything. Their best result has been a 9-1 win against Bootle J.C. which only serves to indicate what they could have achieved. To make matters worse they have been eliminated from the cup due to having played ineligible players, or so the Liverpool Echo tells us.

At the bottom it is going to be return ticket to the 2nd div. for Bootle Y.M. They may be feeling slightly out of their depth but are certainly not overawed. They drew with Eng. Elec. and lost narrowly to Bootle J.C. 6-4 and Elec 'A' 6-4. Jason Killip winning his three against Elec. 'A'

and a lone winner in their 9-1 defeat by Wav. Lab. 'A'. Who will be their companion in relegation? Well right now it is looking possible that it could be Eng. Elec. That could be one for the record book. Champions last season and relegated this season. It is some way from being settled and those looking over their shoulders, who include Y.M. 'A'; Bath St. and possibly G.P.T. will be feeling the draught for some time. They may escape this season, but what about next.

Some good lone wins around, Trevor Owen beat Rob Bevan 17 in the 3rd for a lone win. Jason Killip beat Alan Timewell in two straight. Peter Taylor also beat Rob Bevan going one better by doing it in two straight. Other good wins include a double for Ken Jackson against Cadwa when in addition to beating Ken Hartley also beat Peter Lander. Mike Corcoran recorded and exceptional win against on form Bernie Wentworth, 17 in the 3rd. Amhed Thabit double for Y.M. 'A' included a 19 in the 3rd win against Alec Bryce for a very notable and deserved victory. As always Fred Pheysey has pushed himself into the frame with a 2 straight win against Mike Mahoney. Just won't lie down. Team mate Harry Harrison, back in the League after a long absence, also took a set off Mike. Not a night Mike will want to remember, but he is hampered at the moment with an arm injury and has been playing with it in plaster. Hopefully he is now recovered from his injury.

The cup has been flawed by the apparent failure of some teams to comply with the Cup Regulations. This has resulted, I believe, in Bootle J.C. being awarded a walkover into the Final. The decision to bring the 1/4 final Round forward is one that should be questioned and one wonders just why the Cup Committee made such a unsustainable decision. They obviously failed to consider the implications of their decision. However, the Round was clearly identified and the victims have only themselves to blame. They should have done as Cadwa and Colonsay did, bring forward a match to get the necessary qualifying total for the players they wanted to play. However, if having done this you still play ineligible players then you deserve to be eliminated. Surprisingly enough, there are a lot of players who are unaware of this particular Rule. But at the end of the day it is the club secretary's job to ensure such Rules are correctly complied with. Ignorance of the Law is not an acceptable excuse for breaking it.

In this case your unsuspecting correspondent was half way to Cleveland when the above mentioned henchman produced a stack of Liverpool League cards and announced the new writer of the notes for Division 2 was myself. Oh, and by the way, they are needed immediatly if not before! McEnvoy appearing for Electric Supply. Denise must have used all her powers of persuasion for him to leave the lofty reaches of Div. 1. Nice to see Peter Coyle back in harness for Colonsay. Those who have seen him practise must feel exhausted at his work rate, it's not easy to come back after such a long period away from the game, but Peter is working hard to overcome the handicap, as Trevor Hughes and Frank McCann have found out to their cost. Also nice to see one of our up and coming cadets making the occasional appearance in the division as reserve for Colonsay. Gary Thornton-Allen is no doubt finding things very hard but the experience will stand him in good stead, and he already has the scalp of yours truly to his credit. Also nice to see John Greene playing again, this time for Police. John had a promising start to the game as a junior, but drifted away to other things. On a more sombre note, it is disturbing to find teams at this level conceding walk-overs, and playing short. It would be a shame if promotion and relegation were decided as a result of walk-overs. Five players have so far managed to save their sides from a whitewash :- Bob Hughes (Fords) over Paul Price (GPT 'A'), Barbara Kirkman (Colonsay) over Denise Conroy (Elec. Supply), Billy Proffitt (Fords) over Paul Jennings (Elec. Supply), Eddie Clein (Jewish or is it Harold House?) over Gareth Jones (Police), and Joe Williams (Rodney Youth) over Neil Pasher (Fords).

It's a shame that the cup competition this year has virtually become a non-event, not only in this division but in the league as a whole. Unfortunately bringing the quarter finals of the cup forward to November has caught a lot of teams out. With most divisions being reduced to 12 or less teams, a couple of cancelled matches and your players have problems, in fulfilling the qualification requirement. I fail to see the benefit of bringing the cup week forward in this way. I also fail to see why the management committee did not take a more lenient view of the problems faced by clubs in ensuring qualification was obtainable after all the purpose of the rule was an honest and necessary device to stop the more unscrupulous clubs from importing strong players specifically for the cup, and not intended as an instrument by which to completely destroy the cup competitions by over zealous application. I wonder if any consideration was given to the fact that when the rule was introduced the quarter final stage of the cup competitions was not reached until the second half of the season. Oh well, I've had a moan, let's hope something is sorted out for next season.

Harry, after years in lower divisions is now playing very well, he has settled on a combination bat with one side anti-loop and the other side a secret. He hits winners when they are there to hit and he stops the opponent from playing their game. Harry will beat many good players this season, that should put the curse on you Harry!

Waterloo beat Bath St. 'B' 6-4 with a good all round display, Alan Reid, Ray Hibbs and Ken Nelson winning one each and Alan Walton picking up two. Mega-star Bill Clayton beating Barna bat star Alan Reid 18 and 19. Bill also beat top team No 1 Mark Whittaker 21-19, 22-20 when Bath St. B lost 3-7 to G.P.T.

Julie Prince showed just how to hit against a good defender when playing Reg Edwards in the same match. The first game was tight and Julie only just won it, but then she opened up with her loop and with Reg defending very well Julie showed how to out hit a defender. Where we would chicken out of the third or fourth hit, Julie simply looped harder and finished with a classic forehand kill. Both players played great but most points went Julie's way and she won the second 21-11. Sorry Reg – but it really was a good game to watch.
