## **EDITORIAL**

DIVISION 1 KEN ARMSON

I said last time, who would be a forecaster in this division, and events have proved me correct. Elec Supply don't appear to have stumbled, but Wav. Lab. kept in touch by plugging away. They then played their ace with a 9-1 thrashing of E. Supp. Malcolm saving the 'whitewash' with a win against Dave. This Wav. Lab's nose in front and at present, if E. Supp. were to win their 2 matches in hand 10-0, they would be neck and neck. Rumour has it that E. Supp. have obtained the services of Ian Johns and A. N. Other to help ensure they clinch our 1st. Div. title. Hopefully I am right and it is the L'pool 1st Div. title we are playing for. Is this, I ask myself, a weakness of our new system in that having paid on a per team basis imported players can be brought in at no extra cost.

Eng. Elec. have conceded that relegation will be their fate, but that has not prevented their having a say in the title chase as Mike Corcoran proved when he beat Mike Mahoney in the final set of the night to take a point off Liv. Y.M. It is now left to G.P.T. and Liv. YM 'A' to fight it out with the prize, a precious one, being 1st div. status next season. Anyone who thinks it is tough at the top should try battling it out at the bottom. Much may depend on team turnouts as we saw when Paul Hutchings made a surprise re-appearance for GPT and won his three against. Lab 'A'. They also did their cause a power of good with a draw against Colonsay, Bob Edwards really coming good with a 2 straight win over Chris Ford and getting a second from Peter Coyle. Trevor and Paul chipping in with one each and taking the doubles for the draw. Their match against fellow candidates YM 'A' brought them a 6-4 win and more importantly 6 sets. Once again Peter Taylor was in fine form for YM 'A' winning his three with the 4th coming from Dave Tagg. GPT have kept plugging away by picking up sets from most teams above them. Trevor recorded a good win against Bernie and evened it up by taking one off E. Supp when he beat Paul Kinsey. Bob Edwards has also done his share by picking up the lone sets with a win against Ian McElwee amongst others. But at this stage the strenuous efforts of GPT look like being to no avail, YM 'A' being 9 pts ahead with a game in hand. They also have Peter Taylor in great form and it is his form which has mainly been responsible for their opening up a relegation saving gap. Could even be Vets championship form for our 'Closed' Championships. They took 4 off Bath St. Peter getting 2 which included a win against Ken Jackson. No easy task as many will agree, especially Dave Roberts, Dave Tagg made it a miserable night for Ken by also taking a set off him. It was left to Mike Keane to save Bath St's blushes by winning his three. Against Colonsay they took 5 with Peter again in great form taking his 3 including a 2 straight 15 & 5 against Natasha. Amhed making it a bad night for Natasha by also taking a set off her.

I am still certain E. Supp will take the title in spite of, or, perhaps, because of the pressure being applied by Wav. Lab. This is were nerves come into the reckoning with sets being lost in tight matches which would normally be won. Wav. faced this against YM 'A' when an expected 10.0 became an 8-2. Once again the man of the match being Peter Taylor with wins against Dave and Gary. I can't really see E. Supp needing anyone else to take the title as Wav. will probably lose it in the run in by the dropping

of sets due to the pressure of needing to win. Obviously I will be hoping they prove me wrong.

What about Y.M.? Judging by their results that comet must be nearer than I thought. They are going really well and keeping up the pressure on E.S. and W.L. Much of this has to be due to Keith Williams who is back in top form and proving a great inspiration to his team-mates. For many years Liverpool's most consistent and successful player, and also a most sporting one, he fell away very slightly and this was reflected in Y.M's results. He now appears to have regained his appetite and his team-mates are responding to his lead. Certainly, he seems to be in title winning form and this has come at just the right time for our 'Closed'. I feel certain he is again going to win back the Men's Singles Title and a well deserved win it will be. The team have a great camaraderie and really work and play as a team. Their weakness continues to be their inability to notch up 10-0's against lower teams. Both their recent matches against E. Elec resulting in a dropped set with Mike Corcoran beating Mike Mahoney in one and the redoubtable Ted Birch duffing Mike in the other. Mike M starred in another notable defeat when he lost to D. Oluyumbo in his first appearance this season, possibly his last. This got them both in the 'Echo' much, I am sure, to Mike's chagrin. They could still make it into 2nd place and have the benefit of an easier run-in than W.L. and E.S. But to make certain of this they have to stop dropping winable sets.

Cadwa are still in a good position to take advantage of any slips, only a few pts adrift and turning in consistent results. They got a bonus against Wav. to add to their early season win when Bernie was absent and gifted them 3 sets. This got them a draw. They appear to have lost the services of Neil Gravener, but not their appetite, as they showed with a draw against Y.M. They took 8 off Colonsay, only Natasha managing to subduc Kevin and Phil, but not able to prevent Neil reversing their earlier result.

We now know E. Elec. will go down and their companions likely to accompany them, but Colonsay, in spite of, on paper, a strong team, will look with relief at the final placings for they have flirted with relegation this season to a very dangerous extent. At this stage they are lying 4th from bottom and only ten points above YM 'A'. O.K. they are 20 points ahead of GPT, but the writing is on the wall and they would be well advised to heed it for next season.

The rest are comfortably placed in the middle with no worries but plenty of enjoyment. Who will finish in 5th place is debatable but I fancy Bootle J.C. to sneak in ahead of Bath St. if they can start producing their real form. Their match ended in a draw, Ken and Mike getting the sets for Bath St. Andy Clark getting two for Bootle, but falling to Ken. Honours are fairly even between them with Bath St. taking 3 off Liv. YM and Bootle getting three off E. Supp. including a win for Andy against Mal. The enigma title must now go to Wav. Lab 'A' whose fluctuating results don't rally do them credit. I feel certain they are capable of better and expect them to improve on their present position of 5th from bottom. They have now lost the services of Gary Watson, promoted to 1st team, but this should not really have too great an effect on their results. Rumour has it that we are about to see the return of Phil Luxon which may improve their results, but then again, it might have the opposite effect.

The lengths to which the editor will go to get the notes in on time are unbelievable, on this occasion I was sat in what was left of my car somewhere in darkest Yorkshire wondering how I was going to get home when lo and behold up pops our editors henchman the redoutable Kenneth, who proceeded to stick his head into the car and pass me an envelope of scorecards with the observation that as I was obviously not going anywhere I might as well make a start on my next set of notes. I think it must have been the shock of the crash that prevented me from replying in a rather forthright manner.

Now interesting as all of this is, I'm sure you prefer to see some reference to Table Tennis in these notes so here goes.

I haven't seen anything to make me doubt the accuracy of my previous notes in terms of the promotion and relegation stakes. Cadwa "A" must be odds on favourites to finish winners of the division, always provided they can continue to turn out their strongest team, the fact that they are the only unbeaten team in the division seems to prove the point.

Bootle J C "A" seem to be finding it a little more difficult to pull away from the two GPT teams and must be in some danger of losing second spot unless they can stop dropping silly sets, however I still think they will hold on for the second promotion place. How either of these teams will fare in the top flight is another matter, my own feeling is that they will both struggle unless they can strengthen their respective squads.

The relegation places are still not fully sorted out, Colonsay "A" have picked a few extra points over the first half of the season but I doubt if they can escape the bottom spot, who will keep them company in Div. 3 next season is not at all obvious, either Bath St. "A" or Waterloo would seem to be the obvious candidates. Bath St. "A" seem to be making life difficult for themselves, they have used more players than any other team in the division. They seem to turn out a different team every match with only Bob Hawkins and Karen Gibson turning out on a regular basis. Waterloo seem to have a more settled team with Alan Reid Ray Hicks, Ken Nelson and P. Frazer the apparent first choice team, not an easy team to beat but struggling a little in this division.

Harold House have a slightly different problem, they seem to be unable to get a matched played, they, along with English Electric "A" are 3 matches behind most of the other teams and it would appear, from the cards in my possession, that they have been unable to play Wayne Percival regularly. Perhaps Waynes first match of the season against Colonsay's Natasha Williams destroyed his confidence, I doubt if Wayne has ever lost to a junior girl player in all his years in the game. The fact that Natasha, in what was also her first game of the season, won 21/12; 21/13 against a player of Wayne's ability speaks volumes for the talent of the Welsh junior.

As I suggested in my last notes Colonsay "B" have dragged themselves up from 8th spot to 5th place whether they will stay there largely depends on the two teams below them who have games in hand. Despite that I still feel that Colonsay "B" are more than

capable of holding on to 5th place although they do rely a little too heavily on the two girls, Paula and Brenda picking up sets regularly.

Once again a list of players who saved their teams form a whitewash;

Billy Clayton, Bath St. "A" beat Ian Lunt of English Electric "A".

Alan Reid of Waterloo beat Mark Whittaker GPT "B"

Ken Nelson, Waterloo beat Stuart Fay, Bootle J.C.,

Steve Gittins and Paula French, Colonsay "B" beat Ian Miller and Billy Hargreaves of Cadwa "A".

All of these the only winners in 9/1 defeats.

Natasha Williams for Colonsay "A" beat Wayne Percival and Eddie Clein of Harold House.

Paul Gittins, Police beat Julian Quirk.

Stuart Fay, Bootle J.C., Ian Wensley and Ted Gilmour of GPT "A" beat Mike Power of Cadwa "A".

Bill Harris beat Stuart Fay and Martin Hunter beat Dave Graham in the Bootle J.C. "A" v Colonsay "A" match.

And finally, Dave Garbe and Norman Carter of Fords both beat Rob Davies playing as reserve for Cadwa "A", all in 8/2 defeats.

As a final comment how refreshing it is to find the E.T.T.A. so quickly adopting the directives of the I.T.T.F. in banning the use of soft glues on bats. Not only are such glues a considerable health hazard but are arguably a form of cheating, when are we as a sport going to take away the advantages from the use of unequal equipment and make players equal. I don't advocate the use of only one type of rubber, but how about demanding that both sides of a bat be covered by the same type of rubber, just for starters.

Emma Fletcher beating the always enthusiastic Rob Conley of Electric Supply A and of course the hard to beat George Higham keeps winning whichever position he plays in.

We enjoy the company of 2 Wavertree Labour teams in the Division the B and C teams. Neither seems strong enough to win promotion but nor will they go down. For the B team only Bill Stanley and Geoff Myles appear to be regulars. Good wins by Bill over newly returned to our shores Alan Tolson of GPT C, Bill then combined with Geoff to win their doubles to record their only points. ## **DIVISION 4**

# TONY CONNOR

Well folks, no surprises at the top with Electric Supply played 15, points 116. Wavertree Labour have also played 15 for 104 points and Maghull A are somewhere in between these two. So, with five matches to go a clear hierarchy emerges, and I fear Labour will miss the promotion boat. Doomed Bootle Y.M. yanked three valuable sets off them, with Chris McGuire recording a fine 21-17 win in the third, after being 8-1 down against Labour reserve Francis Lay. In the same match, Tommy Wong (Bootle) blasted Labour's John Reynolds away with some fine hitting 17 and 17. Three pen holders on view here (Francis, Tommy and myself) with Francis continuing his comeback trail by edging Tony McGuire 16 and 20. Staying with Chris, though, he outlasted both Mike Poole and John Hodges of Harold House A 16 and 21 in the 3rd respectively. Especially creditable as Chris had been routed by John 16 and 10 only three weeks earlier. But, how about Jim Geddes (Bootle) versus Mike Poole (Harold House) in the same fixture for a mega turn-around in fortunes. On 18th November an easy 6, 14 win for Mike was recorded but in the return (8th December) Jim clawed his way on top in a -19, 24, 19 thriller.

Each of these 4 sets was a 'homer' verdict, but perhaps the least relished away venue is the table tennis version as Yeovil Towns sloping pitch. Where? Yes, Maghull home patch where our technical advisor Sandie Sanderson demonstrated a 1:4 incline (only slightly exaggerated) from the floor to the back wall by laying a ball on the table and watching it trundle (quickly). To top it all, Maghull A happen to be a very good team as well. No sign, from them, of the frailties inflicting Labour against the lower teams in the division, as 8-2 seems to be their worst victory against teams outside the top four. So who's doing the biz for the A's? They don't actually carry a weakness, with Harry McGanity, Steve Woods, George Frost and Wilf Gibon all way up the averages. It would be more interesting to highlight sets that this quartet have lost. Wilf Gibson 15, -21, -15 to Waterloo's Bill Spencer and -17, -9 to the excellent Clive Chislett of Bath Street (Too good for number 4!). George Frost lost -17, 13, -16 and -13, -12 to Bath Street pair Dave (Hit 'em 'ard) Stoddern and Clive Chislett, Harry McGanity lost out -14, -12 to Labour's John Reynolds whilst Steve Woods lost to Labour's Mike Ashton and Cadwa's Peter Roberts. Sorry lads, but defeats are few and far between for you and the visitors can rightly feel pleased at those results.

So, can Maghull A overtake Supply at the top? Obviously with this level of consistency it is possible, but Alan Biggs and Peter Carney, both functional and tactically excellent NEVER lose. The more flamboyant (and consequently less consistent) Trevor Hughes and Arthur harrison might yet lose enough to let in Maghull, but I doubt it. I also doubt there is a better back-hand hit/loop outside of the 1st division than Trevor's.

Bath Street also ride high (4th) and might well fancy their chances of a late promotion run. I know that Supply have the utmost respect for this quintet of Rob Peat, John Langton, Dave Stoddern, Pete Mercer and Clive Chislett and, if, as expected, they meet in the cup final, this is likely to be a closely run affair. When Clive meets Peter Carney (Supply) in the battle of the 4's, someones unbeaten record has to go, but I wouldn't like to predict which. Rob Peat and John Langton continue their GBH to TSP's but both struggled to overcome Tom Downing 20 and 13 in the 3rd respectively in the 7-3 victory over GPT 'D'. In the same match Bobby Bell routed Rob Peat 16 and 19 for an excellent win before succumbing to Dave Stodderns particular brand of cruelty to balls later in the match.

Amazingly, Harold House A have achieved a level of consistency in team selection, as nine players used in four early matches (last notes) has not multiplied to twenty two players in ten matches. In fact, it remains at nine players. Clearly, there is some talent available here with Bob Hudson, Paul Morgan, Mike Poole and Dave Cohen combining to beat GPT 10 nil. They are a clear 5th and have the players to trouble anyone with John Hodges also turning out.

Harold House B aren't faring as well and compete with Bootle YMCA for the wooden spoon, but they do have a recruitment policy second to none. No, they don't target the schools, nor run coaching sessions. Far more sophisticated than that.

Yes, it's true folks, Les is a fine acquisition winning many despite his teams lowly position. In the 3-7 reversal against their A team, he shaded Dave Cohen 22/20, 22/20. Ted Cramsie wins most when he plays (eg John Langton 14 in the 3rd) but overall, this promoted team is finding it too hot in the 4th division.

Maghull B are clear of relegation danger and mid-table respectability beckons. Phil Christie is finding form and demolished Cadwa's Peter Roberts 15 and 16, and Russell Thornton 7 and 14. Waterloo cling to a mid-table spot, but amazingly have won none and lost seven out of 10. Obviously, many 4-6 reversals. They continue to rely on Bill Spencer and John Forest for many of their sets, but Fraser Farquarson's victory over GPT's Bobby Bell -11, 18, 18 helped Waterloo to a draw. One of only three draws all season so far all involving Waterloo.

# **URGENT REGULATIONS**

The following regulations from the ETA regarding 'gluing up' came into force on 29th January, 1993.

The Use of fast glue is banned as from 24th January, 1993.

No gluing up of any kind is allowed during any table tennis match or tournament.

If a bat is glued up using an approved glue, this must be done at least 48 before the bat is used.

The above is only a summary of the major points of the new regulations, when I receive, a copy of the regulation, copies will be sent to all club secretaries.
