

SECRETARY'S REPORT Mike Power

During the course of this season I have had several phone calls basically suggesting some of our rules are either over-the-top or need a dam good looking at. In particular, the rules governing a player's eligibility for cup competitions where several teams have been thrown out this season for playing an ineligible player. I have reminded those people that they can propose rule amendments for inclusion on the agenda at the AGM, I have also stated that if they need any assistance in putting the proposal together. I will always help. The final date for any proposal is Saturday 26th February. At the time of writing there are only 8 days to go before this cut-off point is reached and I have to date received the grand total of zero proposed amendments! There is little doubt in my mind that you are reading this 'post 26th February', and I expect we will still have no new proposals on the table! There is no point complaining about the rules to the MC as you, the clubs, have put the rules together over the years. The MC only enforces the rules you have made whether originally proposed by the MC or proposed by a club.

The Management Committee are moving towards arranging Public Liability insurance, not only for the MC members and League events, but also for all registered clubs within the League however the earliest this MAY be available is September / October 2005. This will hopefully be via the ETTA block policy. If and when this happens the onus will still be on each club to ensure the cover this policy provides satisfies their requirements as under current legislation the League are not authorised to advise you. This cover will obviously come at a price but we do not expect it to be an extortionate amount and will be discussed at the next AGM at the end of May 2005. I would remind all



club secretaries that it is incumbent on you all to ensure you have adequate insurance protection against the inevitable accident. In this litigious society it is vital your club, and each individual, be it one of your own members or a visitor, is covered. You may say that no-one has ever sued us in the past, well I would remind you that Everton have never played in the Champions League either! (Hopefully they never will).

After 10 years in the wilderness Mal McEvov is back and playing for Fords. After an even longer break. Clive Stretle is also back, also with Fords. It appears that Tim Weardon is assembling quite a squad and seems certain to overcome the 20 points deduction their first team suffered at the beginning of the season and avoid the possibility of relegation. If this team stays together next season with Kevin Dolder at the helm they could be challenging for honours. It appears this season as though Keith Williams and Co. will win another first division championship, this time with Waterloo with only Liverpool YMCA having any realistic chance of catching them. (How many clubs has Keith won the first division with?) It also looks likely that next season the first division will incorporate 3 teams from Liverpool YMCA.

The MC's decision at the beginning of the season to place Greenbank into the 3rd division looks to have been the correct one, as they appear to be well on their way to the 2rd already. I don't know what's going to happen to the 5th division next season. With only 6 teams left it looks as though the writing is on the wall. Any suggestions are always welcome.

Finally, lets try and make sure there are no walkovers given between now and the end of the season. I have commented before that this always seems to happen but it has an extremely annoying affect. Simply by not playing a match, maybe because you are a mid-table side and feel there is nothing at stake, you inadvertently give someone a lifeline and help them to avoid relegation. The problem is of course that someone else gets relegated instead and after battling hard all season this becomes a bitter pill to swallow. It can obviously have the same affect at the top of a division as well. So come on Club Sec's, lets make sure this doesn't happen again. Look forward to seeing you all at the 'Closed', even the Evertonians.

APPEALS PANEL

BOARD of APPEAL MEETING 16th, February 2005

The APPEALS PANEL, namely, Brian Leeson, Jack Lambert and Dave Graham.

The Panel decided unanimously to uphold CADWA's appeal against the Management Committee's decision to declare void the three singles games in the CADWA v M/Side Police (Div.1) match, in which an alleged illegal bat was to be used by a CADWA player, the Panel decided that the three un-played games should be awarded to CADWA for the following reason.

An individual player, or players, cannot refuse to play, for whatever reason, if an opponent is there willing and waiting to play. When there is no qualified official appointed, no one player or players can make that decision. A complaint in **writing** to the Organising Secretary / Management Committee should be made within the specified time limit as per rule (*Management Rule 3 page 4*) and the match card returned unsigned. The opponent (s) must be informed of the proposed action.

To sum up, all sets and games must be played and complaints registered later in the correct way.

To give a bit of background for this appeal to the readers, a member of the Police team complained about the surface of the bat of a CADWA player, which although a perfectly legal rubber; in the opinion of the Police player, the rubber had two alleged creases in it as like a "back to front" Nike tick, and that the surface on the blade was not consistent. The CADWA player pointed out that he neither sought nor obtained any advantage from the creases, but that it is very difficult to glue these particular sheets on without causing bubbles', so the three games involving this bat weren't played. At the last Management Committee meeting it was decided that in view of the circumstances surrounding this issue, the 3 singles matches involved be declared void, and the Clubs concerned be advised of the procedure they should follow should such circumstances arise at any future match. CADWA appealed against this decision.

As the appeal panel point out, unless there is a "qualified" umpire to check the bat no one can decide if the bat is illegal or not, the games must be played, as many facts as possible should be recorded, then an official written complaint made.

On looking through the various rules on Bats / Rackets, there isn't a let of help on this regards condition of rubber, the ETTA rule does go someway, but who's to judge weeks after the event. Our own rules only ask for the ITTF Logo as well as the red / black sides, I remember many years ago I was cutting a new sheet of rubber.

I laid it out, marked around the bat, cut it out, turned it over to glue to the blade, and yes, the logo was at the top of the bat, what a waste, had to get a new rubber, but on reflection now, that logo was "near the edge of the striking surface" even though it was the wrong end of the bat, could I have saved myself £20 !, wishful thinking, but could a good barrister get round that one, gladdy commonsense prevails.

ETTA & ITTF

2.4.7 Slight deviations from continuity of surface or uniformity of colour due to accidental damage or wear may be allowed provided that they do not significantly change the characteristics of the surface.

2.4.8 At the start of a match and whenever he changes his racket during a match a player shall show his opponent and the umpire the racket he is about to use and shall allow them to examine it.

Club / League Welfare Officers

The L&DTTL has received correspondence from the ETTA requesting that Nationally every Club (or League) nominate a Club / League Welfare Officer to be the local Child Protection point of contact.

In November 2004 the ETTA began the process of asking Clubs and /or Leagues to appoint welfare officers. These volunteers will be the local point of contact for any child protection issues, although they will have, other than in an emergency situation, a reporting role ensuring that the ETTA's Child Protection Officer is kept informed of any reported suspicions relating to child abuse. These officers will never be put in the position of deciding whether or not abuse is taking place. In addition they will provide a local network for the dissemination of information to our members. A requirement of the local post would be attendance at tournaments run by the L&DTTL.

It is anticipated that the role should take no more than 1-2 hours maximum per week.

During 2005 the ETTA's Child Protection Officer will be holding a number of 2 hour evening workshops with welfare officers looking at the ETTA's processes and procedures relating to child protection. The nominated person would receive an induction pack with information to assist him / her in their roll.

The Club/League Welfare Officer is NOT expected to make judgements on whether child abuse has or has not taken place but to ensure that either the appropriate authorities or the ETTA's National Equity and Child Protection Officer are informed of any suspicions as soon as possible. The Club/League Welfare Officer will be expected to advise the ETTA's National Equity and Child Protection Officer of any such reports and any local action taken


Paul Drinkhall, 15, the England number one Junior and ton seed in the Stiga Liverpool Junior Star Open. generously supported by Liverpool City Council, swept aside all opposition, taking both the Cadet and Junior boys' singles titles. Cleveland youngster didn't drop a game in the Cadet event, Bath Street's Jamie Hewitt being his first victim, 11-4, 11-2, 11-4. Not until he faced Scotland's Craig Howicson, did he lose more than eight points, taking the title and a £100 cheque with an 11-4, 12-10, 12-10 final victory.

Drinkhall, England's match winning hero in the recent European League encounter with The Netherlands, repeated the feat in the Junior Boys' singles, account-

ing for Howieson in the second round, 11-5, 11-5, 11-8, feating Scottish top seed Corinna Whitaker, 16-14, 11-7, after the Scot had taken the first game. He didn't have it 11-8 in the final.
