Bath Street's Ken Jackson, made a rare appearance following a long lay off which helped the club's first team to a healthy victory at Christ The King A. Dave Tagg and Ahmed Thabet were both victims, the former losing 11-4 in the fifth, his only loss was to Tony Whelan. Dave Roberts was the star man though for the visitors, remaining unbeaten in his four trips to the table, Bath Street winning 7-3.

Although Bath St. F were comfortably beaten in their division 5 match at Bootle YMCA C, arguably, the best performance on the night, came from Barbara Alcock. With her team 7-0 down and trailing 2-0 to Jim Geddes, the longest surviving female Liverpool closed title winner still playing in the league, (**she won the first of her two mixed titles in 1958**) fought back to win 11-8 in the decider. She also came close in her other set but lost 11-7 in the fifth to Gary Williamson, after leading by two games to one.

Paul Oakes further reduced the arrears in the penultimate set, beating John Taylor 3-2, before the YM' took the last set to complete an 8-2 victory.

Maghull A and Harold House A met for the second time in February, but on this occasion it was in second division action - their previous clash in the Rumjahn cup ending in victory for the Childwall club. The home side turned out the same trio, but lost this one 10-0 to the HH trio of Alec Bryce, Steve Whalley and Adam Ranftler who came in for Neil Baker - only one encounter requiring a fifth game.

Also in division two, a Dave Harse treble set Manweb A on course for victory at home to Wavertree Labour A via successes over John Rowan, Paul Banks and Bill Stanley.

Maghull B were gifted three walk over sets by Harold House C when the sides met in division three. They were, however, only able to add a further three points - Rod Bulmer with 3-1 successes over Martin Roberts and Rod McPherson - Phil Christie chipping in with a win over Martin, the match ending up 5-5.

Another division three clash finishing all square was at Sefton Park C.C. when Aigburth entertained Cadwa A. Home side number one Alan Davies, put the boot in on his former club, who stand just one place from the foot of the table, winning his three singles events. Alan looked to be heading for defeat at 2-0 down to Mike Power, before turning in a fine recovery to ease home, 11-4 in the decider. He also joined forces with Lee Proffitt to overcome Mike and Peter Roberts in the doubles - Lee chipping in with his sides fifth, beating Steve Graham. Cadwa's points came via three from reserve Norman Lindsay plus two from Mike Power and a Roberts win against Proffitt.
